## Project team to present refined streetscape design concepts for Del Paso Boulevard at community meeting

The City of Sacramento is leading an effort to improve Del Paso Boulevard between State Highway 160 and Arden Way. The project will determine what kind of intersection improvements, sidewalks, enhanced crosswalks, better access to public transit, new trees and landscaping are needed. The enhancements will build upon previous planning and revitalization efforts along the boulevard.

**WHAT:** A community meeting to review and discuss the refined Del Paso Boulevard streetscape design concepts, the final traffic analysis study and the just released environmental document for the project.

**WHO:** Councilmember Sandy Sheedy, City staff, SHRA staff and consultant team.

**WHEN:** Thursday, October 1, 6 p.m.

**WHERE:** Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA) Building, 925 Del Paso Boulevard

**WHY:** To discuss the many pedestrian and driver safety benefits and aesthetic benefits the project will bring to Del Paso Boulevard residential and business communities and to take comments on the environmental document.
