**APPOINTMENT:**

Nine (9) members as follows:

- A. Three (3) appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council
- B. Five (5) appointed by the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors
- C. One (1) appointed jointly by Folsom, Isleton and Galt

The appointing authorities strive to provide for appointment of members from the following vocational disciplines/areas of interest or experience: health and legal services, engineering, transportation planning, environmental group, toxins/hazardous materials, environmental health, industrial hygiene, water quality, waste disposal, land use planning, vector control, chemical reuse/recycling and the general public, and other disciplines

Elected officials including appointed members and full-time salaried employees of the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, City Councils, special districts, or the regulatory agencies of Sacramento County are not eligible for membership.

**TERM:**

Three (3) year term. Two term limit applies to City appointees. County members in good standing are eligible for reappointment per County Ordinance SCC-0733.

**MEETING INFO:**

Meetings are usually held the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of the month at 6:00pm in the Main Conference Room at 10590 Armstrong Ave, Mather, CA 95655. The meetings for January, April, July and October are held at the County Board of Supervisors' Chambers on 700 H Street at 6:30pm.

**COMPENSATION:**

\$50.00 per meeting attended, not to exceed \$100.00 per month. Subcommittee meetings shall be considered eligible for compensation.

**POWERS & DUTIES:**

The powers and duties of this board include:

Advise the City Council and the Board of Supervisors with respect to needs for effective implementation of an environmental management program; aid and advise the Sacramento County Environmental Management Department in the formulation and implementations of its programs, including consideration of air quality, environmental health, and hazardous materials control within the boundaries of Sacramento County; assess the impact of state and federal requirements and regulations; review and approve contents of proposed ordinances, rules and regulations.
