1. **Call to Order** – 6:15 p.m.
2. **Roll Call - Present:** Rick Braziel, Danette Brown, Renee Carter, Alex Eng, Jerry Enomoto, Aaron Evans, John Floyd, Linda Love. **Excused Absences:** Ernest Carter, Jason Sample, David Topaz, Manuel Valencia. **Absences:** John Vigna.
3. **Pledge of Allegiance** - Led by Renee Carter.
4. **Approval of Minutes of January 19, 2006 Meeting** - Approved. MOV: Floyd; SEC: Eng. AYES: Braziel, Brown, R Carter, Eng, Enomoto, Evans, Floyd, Love.
5. **New Member Update and Orientation Training** – An update was given by staff about the pending appointment to District 1 and confirmation to District 6. Rick Braziel will contact the Mayor and City Council office as a reminder to move appointments forward. Commission training by the City Clerk will wait until all members are in place.
6. **Website Update and Demo** – Staff showed a demo of the draft Racial Profiling Commission website. Specific issues discussed about the website content included the following:
  - a. Contact phone number or e-mail address: Various private and City phone and e-mail options will be explored and reported at the March meeting.
  - b. Location of website on City homepage: Staff stated that the Commission’s primary webpage link would be located under the City’s Accountability link, as determined at an earlier Commission meeting, with links to and from the Police Department.
  - c. Availability of former data collection reports: Alex Eng suggested that data collection reports produced by the former consultant (University of Southern California) could be made available through the website. Discussion on this topic included: the age of the reports; web or mail accessibility; and the fact that they were not created under the auspices of this Commission. It was voted to wait and see if requests for former reports are received, and to determine how to make reports available at that time if necessary.

7. **Update on Data Collection Consultant Contract and Planned Activities** – Rick Braziel reported that Lamberth Consulting’s contract was approved at the February 14, 2006 City Council meeting. Renee Carter, who also presented at the Council meeting, reported that the Lamberth choice was well-received by the City Council, and that she had stated to the Council that the Commission believed Lamberth would produce an unbiased report, and that they would go beyond focusing only on stats. Staff reported that Lamberth would be in Sacramento for their project kick-off March 21 and 22. The Commission voted to reschedule the March 16 Commission meeting to March 21 in order to meet with Lamberth.

John Floyd recommended that new Commissioners review Lamberth's proposal which will be mailed to them before the March meeting.
