1. **Call to Order** – 6:08 p.m.
2. **Roll Call** – Present: Danette Brown, Ernest Carter, Renee Carter, Sean Coletta, John Floyd, Brent Meyer, Steve Segura, Francine Tournour, Julia Vera. **Excused:** Walter Kawamoto, Crystal Taylor. **Absent:** Manuel Valencia.
3. **Pledge of Allegiance** – Led by Ernest Carter.
4. **Update on Commission Membership** –
  - ❖ Thank you to Deputy Chief Steve Segura for his 30 years of service with the Sacramento Police Department.
  - ❖ Brent Meyer, Sacramento Police Officers Association President and new CRPC member, introduced himself to the Commission.
  - ❖ Daniela Lopez-Garcia has been appointed to the District 5 seat on the Commission, effective October 2, 2007.
  - ❖ The posting for the Districts 3 (Valencia) and 5 (Lopez-Garcia) seats, as well as two At-Large seats (E. Carter, Brown) will remain open until November 9, 2007. Ms. Lopez-Garcia does not need to re-apply for District 5, but must be re-nominated for the seat.
  - ❖ The Mayor and City Council are reviewing applications for the vacant seats representing City Council Districts 1 and 8.
5. **Approval of Minutes of September 22, 2007 Meeting** –  
**Action:** Moved, seconded, and carried (Floyd/Coletta; Abstain - Meyer) to approve the minutes of the October 18, 2007 meeting.
6. **Discussion on Lamberth Workshop and Lamberth Study Release** –  
Commission members:
  - ❖ Shared impressions of the Lamberth workshop, noting the diversity of perspectives of the traffic stop racial profiling issue;
  - ❖ Discussed how the Lamberth study results will be presented to the City Manager, the Commission, the City Council, and the community;
  - ❖ Determined that the Commission will prepare a written report on the study results;
  - ❖ Noted that a communication specialist will be working with the Commission to produce the written report and facilitate their interactions with the City Council and the community;
  - ❖ Expressed the desire to ask the City Manager to attend the December CRPC meeting.

**7. Operational Update on Police Department Activities –**

Deputy Chief Segura reported:

- ❖ No special operations occurred during the past month;
- ❖ The City experienced no gang-related homicides during the past month;
- ❖ The Police Department is participating in the IBIS (Integrated Ballistics Identification System) program, a computer identification system that correlates and matches projectile and shell casing ballistic evidence in a national database. IBIS can determine if bullets fired from a gun can be linked to other crimes, possibly gang-related, and increase the potential for criminal prosecution.

**8. Commission Comments – Ideas and Questions**

- ❖ Members discussed the Grant Joint Union High School District Police Department and learned that the Department has the authority to make traffic stops at locations outside school property.
- ❖ Chair Ernest Carter noted that in November the Commission would discuss the San Antonio Racial Profiling Data Analysis produced by Lamberth Consulting.
- ❖ At the next meeting in November, the Commission will be nominating candidates for Chair in 2008.

None.

**10. Adjournment –** There being no further business of the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 7:15 p.m.
