FREE Spay/Neuter & Vaccination Clinic

The City of Sacramento Animal Care Services offers a free spay/neuter clinic and a free vaccination clinic for dogs and cats. The owner must provide proof of low-income status/public welfare assistance and must reside within the city limits of Sacramento. This clinic is generally held on the third Sunday of each month. To make an appointment, please call and leave a message.

- An appointment is required for spay and neuter services. NO walk-ins.
- The vaccination clinic is held from 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM on the third Sunday of each month and appointments are NOT necessary. Please note that there are NO clinics in December.
- Proof of residency within the city limits of Sacramento and proof of low-income status are required.

Very Important Reasons to Spay and Neuter

- 1. Reduces behavior problems**, such as aggression, territorial marking/spraying, excessive barking, yowling and fighting and escaping the yard/roaming. Statistics show that unaltered dogs, regardless of breed, are twice as likely to bite and/or attack.
- 2. Reduces certain types of cancers**, such as testicular and prostate cancer in males, and mammary, uterine and ovarian cancers in females. Also eliminates many reproductive system infections.
- 3. Eliminates messy "heats" in females.**
- 4. Spayed/neutered dogs and cats are less expensive to license. Only \$15 (vs. \$150) yearly for dogs and \$10 (vs. \$75) yearly for cats in the city of Sacramento.** By law, all dogs and cats within the city of Sacramento must be licensed.
- 5. Reduces pet-over-population!** More than 23,000 unwanted and stray animals are killed each year in Sacramento area shelters. Please help us save lives!
